NBEA Scholarship Program

Each year, NBEA awards two \$1,000 scholarships to members pursuing continuing education or graduate study in business education. The scholarships will recognize and support educators who have given evidence of leadership and scholarship potential in the field of business education. To be eligible, applicants must:

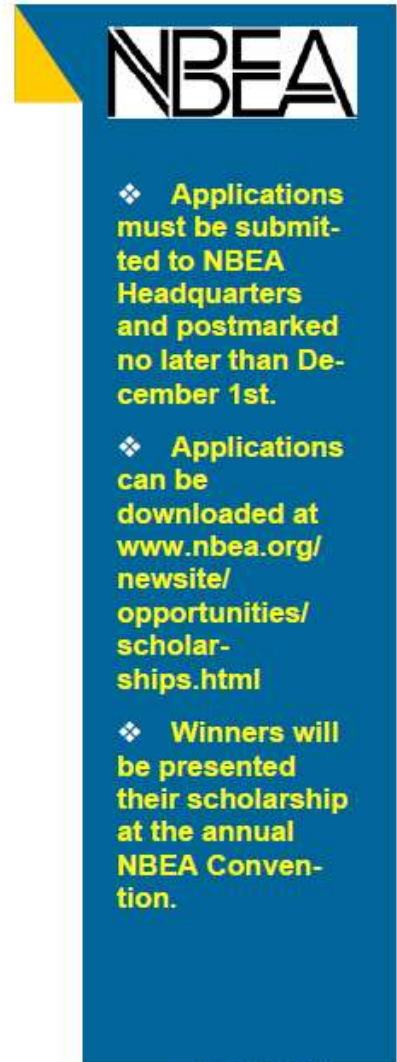
- Be enrolled in a college or university post baccalaureate or graduate-level program and submit proof of enrollment.
- Be enrolled in a business education program and/or other related areas in business
- Submit proof of completion of at least two graduate courses (six semester hours)
- Submit a one-page letter. Letter criteria is identified on the application form
- Submit a current resume
- Submit two letters of recommendation
- Be currently teaching and plan to continue to teach in the field of business education
- Be a current professional NBEA member with a minimum of one full year of NBEA membership

Applications are due to the NBEA office by December 1, 2011 and winners will be presented their scholarships at the annual NBEA convention.

AWARDED ANNUALLY AT NATIONAL CONVENTION

Each year, NBEA awards two \$1,000 scholarships to individuals pursuing continuing education or graduate study in business education. The scholarships recognize and support educators who give evidence of leadership and scholarship potential in the field of business education. The NBEA Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to outstanding individuals for the purpose of continuing their study and professional development in business education.

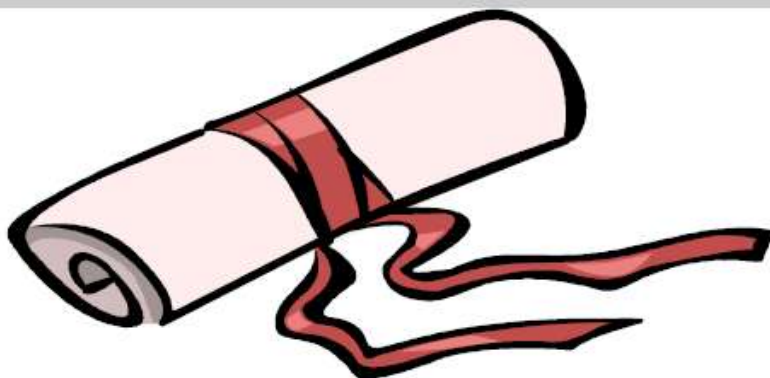
Qualification Requirements

- > Be enrolled in a college or university post-baccalaureate or graduate-level program and submit proof of enrollment
- > Be enrolled in a business education program and/or other related areas in business
- > Submit proof of completion of at least two graduate courses (six semester hours)
- > Submit a current resume
- > Be a current member of NBEA at the time of application
- > Submit two letters of recommendation attesting to the scholarship/ leadership potential of the applicant
- > Be currently teaching and plan to continue to teach, or plan to teach upon completion of the program, in the field of business education
- > Submit a one-page letter describing the following bulleted items:
 - Past contributions to the field of business education
 - Plans to utilize the degree in the future
 - Two or three significant issues in business education
 - Why the applicant should be the recipient of the award

❖ Applications must be submitted to NBEA Headquarters and postmarked no later than December 1st.

❖ Winners will be presented their scholarship at the annual NBEA Convention.

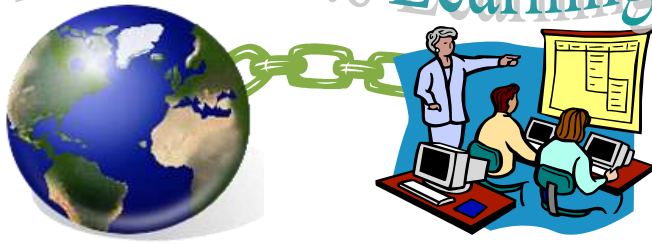
